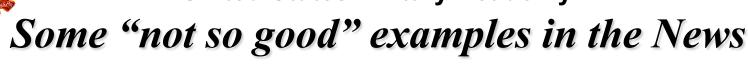

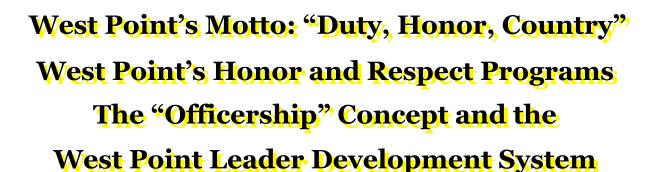

Honor- Live up to all the Army Values

Integrity- Do what's right, legally and morally

Personal Courage- Face fear, danger, or adversity

- 12. Attitude and Enthusiasm are KEY!
- 13. Solution Oriented... rather than problem oriented!

  \*Remember "25/25/50"
- 14. Cool/Calm/Confident in crisis!
- 15. Command Respect... rather than DEMAND respect
- 16. Rewards/Punishments!
